



# Caring for Country

NESA Registered Professional Learning Program – 10 hours

Starting in the magnificent Muogamarra Nature Reserve, Caring for Country is a NESA registered professional learning program that provides an opportunity for teachers to learn about and experience the traditional practices of the local Aboriginal people and how this information can be incorporated into Geography and History inquiry-based frameworks.

This program consist of three components:

**Phase 1: One-day workshop at Muogamarra Nature Reserve**  
**Term 2 Workshop - Friday 17 May**  
**Term 3 Workshop - Friday 2 August**

Workshop participants will:

- ✓ engage in on-Country activities including an introduction to the local Aboriginal people, their culture and land practices (including bush tucker)
- ✓ visit important Aboriginal cultural engraving sites
- ✓ examine strategies for incorporating Aboriginal histories and cultures into inquiry-based frameworks for History and Geography

**Phase 2: Development and implementation of a learning sequence at school during that term**

**Phase 3: A sharing video conference in Week 7 or 8 of that term**
